PRESIDENT'S CORNER

Greetings to all Sugarloaf Association Members!

May is typically the time that the city of San Mateo reminds homeowners of their responsibility under the law to provide a defensible space in protecting against wildfires. You should have recently received such a notice. Please note that the Association has a similar responsibility to maintain common spaces, especially including those that extend down into the canyons. We have an annual program to clear brush in all common spaces in accordance with the law's requirements. The brush clearing is scheduled to occur in late May and/or early June. Additionally, we plan to execute a large-tree trimming project this June/July in the open space between De Anza and Cherrywood. This represents the second and final phase of the 2008/2009 project to comply with fire codes related to large trees. Please note that there was a mountain lion sighting in early May in the open space between De Anza and Cherrywood. Additionally, coyotes have been noted in this area as well. Please exercise appropriate caution when in and around open spaces, particularly in the early morning or evening hours. It is also a good idea to carefully monitor your pets when they are outside the house.

Finally, I'd like to continue the focus on community safety. There was a car break-in on the lower part of Parkwood at the tennis courts. In this case, the car contained electronics equipment in plain view. Please do not leave valuables in your parked cars, especially not in plain sight. This only invites problems.

ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE

LANDSCAPE

Maintenance crew have been checking and replacing broken sprinkler heads. The system is now in full operation.

Jim Cozzolino and crew will be looking to enhance the common areas in front of houses with new plantings with particular attention to the DeAnza area.

For the next week or two, the crew will be busy clearing the 100 ft. defensible fire zone of grasses and brush. They will be back to normal maintenance routine by mid-June at the latest.

Phase 2 of the tree project will start in July. More on that issue next newsletter.

PUBLIC SAFETY

The city of San Mateo is now equipped to take 911 calls directly from cell phones IF the call originates within the city. However, when dialing 911 from cell phones in areas near Highway 92, you may still be connected to the Highway Patrol's 911 service, which could delay response. To ensure you are connected to the SMPD 911 interface, you'll want to dial 650-522-7700 if you're on a cell phone. You may want to add this number to your speed dial on your cell. If dialing from a land line, your call will automatically be routed to the SMPD 911 service.
