12 noon to 4 pm on Sunday.

LANDSCAPE

In addition to standard activities, the following work was done in late July and early August:

- 1501 De Anza Trimmed shrubbery reaching over sidewalk towards lower De Anza
- Repaired irrigation in common area behind 3401 Cheryl Ct.
- Removed leaf build-up and twigs between 1858-1826 Parkwood slope
- Trimmed Douglas and Westwood common areas
- Trimmed Oakhill-Allison common areas.

The California Buckeye trees along Parkwood, Denali side, are not dying, but are going through their normal cycle of dropping their leaves in summer. New foliage will appear in very early spring.

As a reminder, please do not trim or cut any trees in the common areas. If you have a concern, call PML or talk to a Board member. We have a process to follow in these situations. Thanks for your cooperation.

** SPECIAL NOTE ON LANDSCAPE MAINTENANCE

Fortunately, most Sugarloaf Homeowners maintain their frontal landscaped area. But there are a few homeowners that are not giving their front yard the proper attention. One weed-infested front yard impacts the entire neighborhood and can contribute to reducing property values.

In the past, the Board of Directors (Board) has sent a letter to homeowners requesting that they properly maintain their frontal landscaping. Most homeowners have complied with this request, but there are still a few (usually the same ones year after year) that choose not to respond to the Board's requests.

The CC&R's give the Board the right to take action if the frontal landscaped areas are not maintained in accordance with Article 4, Section 4.02.

The Board will now take action in accordance with this Section if a homeowner chooses not to respond to the first letter requesting that they properly maintain their frontal landscaped area. A non-response to this initial letter within 30 days will result in a second letter, asking the homeowner to appear before the Board. If the problem is still not resolved, either from a non-appearance or the homeowner not correcting the issue, then the Board will have to take action in accordance with Section 4.02. This will result in having the Association's landscape contractor clean up the frontal landscaped area and sending the offending homeowner an invoice for the work done.

These new signs are part of the Board's effort to revitalize the Neighborhood Watch program and will hopefully be a reminder to all Sugarloaf residents that any suspicious activity should be reported immediately to the San Mateo Police Department. The easiest and fastest way to report suspicious activity is to dial 522-7700. This is a direct line to the SMPD dispatcher, so please provide as much information as you can such as the description of the people involved, type of car and color and, if possible, a license plate number. For the Neighborhood Watch program to be truly effective, we need several residents to volunteer as "Block Captains". This task requires very little time and effort, so please call or email any board member if you are willing to help out. Finally, and in conjunction with the Neighborhood Watch Program, all residents are requested to provide an email address so that important public safety information can be communicated quickly. If you have not already done so, please visit our website home page to subscribe. The board is mindful of the privacy of your contact information and will safeguard it appropriately.
