PRESIDENT'S CORNER

The generous rains we had during the winter and spring have certainly led to an abundance of grasses and other vegetation on our properties and common spaces! Of course, that means that there will be plenty of fuel come fire season. As per our annual practices, the Association will be conducting our usual weed abatement (brush clearing) work in the coming month or two (probably June/July). Many of the grasses/weeds are still very green and will re-chute if cut too early. As always, we work very closely with the San Mateo Fire Department on our fire protection programs.

Annual Dues – We still have several owners who have not paid their 2011 annual dues (late after Feb 15). This is a reminder to owners that the Association may charge both late fees and interest fees on delinquent dues. Additionally, owners will be charged the cost of delinquency notice letters that PML sends on our behalf (at the going rate for a property management firm). The Board would certainly like to avoid going down the path filled with fees. If you are having a financial challenge, please contact PML or a Board member to discuss setting up a payment plan. The Board reserves the right to waive certain fees if an owner is making an effort to meet their obligations.

ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE

The Architectural Control Committee will be conducting its annual audit of our property exteriors during the last week of May. The committee performs this service every year to identify homes that are not in compliance with CC&R Article 4.02B, which requires owners to maintain property exteriors in a state of repair conducive to maintaining property values. The audit findings are primarily regarding painting and landscaping. If you have any questions or concerns about the audit, please contact the committee. Audit findings will be communicated to affected owners within a few weeks of the audit, with specific timelines requested for repairs. Thanks for your cooperation.

LANDSCAPE

In addition to standard activities, the following work was done in late April and May:

- Removed bags of concrete in landscape area on Parkwood Drive.
- Trimmed lower branches of Cedar Trees near 1826 Parkwood to encourage growth.
- DeAnza areas- lower height in tree saplings and unwanted growth. Clear sidewalks of leaves weekly.
- Turned on irrigation system. Repaired breaks in irrigation lines (2) on Parkwood Drive. If you see a leak, please notify PML immediately or contact the Landscape committee. Every minute costs water and \$\$!

Weed Abatement

As mentioned in the President's column, due to the wet winter, the weeds and brush are growing early and fast. We have been asked, when are we going to cut the weeds in the common areas? We don't cut until the weeds and brush turn brown, usually the middle of June. We do encourage you to keep the weeds down in your yard now. You're likely to hear from the Fire Department soon about your fire safety responsibilities on your property.

As a reminder, please do not trim or cut any trees in the common areas. If you have a concern, call PML or talk to a Board member. We have a process to follow in these situations. Thanks for your cooperation. Finally, if you see anyone dumping trash in a common area, please report it to PML.

As a reminder, the Association Bylaws and the Declaration (CC&Rs) are posted on our website for your convenience, but you will need a password to open them (password in paper newsletter copy).

TRASH / RECYCLING - GROWING PAINS

Please remember that attention be given to spacing the containers at least 2 feet apart to allow room for the mechanical claw to grasp each container, and avoid placing the containers in front of a mail box. This will result in a possible interruption of mail delivery since the containers will be returned to the same position, obstructing the mailbox.

Also, there are smaller containers available that may be easier to store out of sight, and you don't have to keep the green container (compost) if you have no use for it. Contact Recology San Mateo 650-595-3900 or carts@recology.com to inquire.

PUBLIC SAFETY

Rattlesnakes

May marks the start of rattlesnake season, and they do exist in our area. Anyone who encounters a rattlesnake should not disturb or corner it, just move away from the snake and it will typically slither off. Baby rattlers are potentially more dangerous than adults because they don't have control over how much venom they inject when biting. Be aware and be careful.

SEWER LATERALS UPDATE

The city of San Mateo continues to work on changes to sewer lateral maintenance policy. We don't expect any changes to be approved by the City Council before June, but we do expect the changes will impact our residents who live on public streets (De Anza, Parkwood, Toyon). The City will likely change the municipal code to place more/all of the responsibility for repairing failed laterals under city streets onto the homeowner served by the lateral. We have been working with the Department of Public Works to push for city funding for needed repairs, and for city coordination and relief of the red tape & fees associated with repairs on city streets. We expect that the DPW's updated proposal will be presented to the Public Works Commission in early June, and your Board will represent Sugarloaf interests. Although residents cannot insure the sewer lateral running under the city or private street, they may insure the section of lateral running on their property between the street and their house. This insurance is offered through Cal Water, who recently sent information by mail. You can also call Home Emergency Insurance Solutions direct at 877-444-2465 for information. Each homeowner should make his/her own decision about insurance.
