ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE

PLEASE Don't Paint Your Neighbor's Wall! When you paint your home, please note that *only* the walls supporting *your* roof will be painted in your color scheme. Your neighbor's party wall (wall facing your property, but supports neighbor's roof) needs to remain painted in your neighbor's color scheme. This ensures

that our homes have the proper appearance for where one home ends and the other begins (i.e., single family home appearance, not conjoined units). If the party wall is faded and in need of paint, with your neighbor's permission, you may refresh its appearance by painting in your neighbor's color scheme. If you have any questions, please contact the Architecture Committee. Thanks for your support in keeping property values as high as possible.

LANDSCAPE

In addition to standard activities, the following work was or will be performed in July/August:

- Removed Pampas grass in common area behind 1633 DeAnza.
- Removed Yucca branches in common area behind 1613 Toyon.
- Adjusted varies sprinkles in common areas.
- Trimmed shrubbery back from curb at retaining wall on Parkwood Dr to allow street sweeper access.
- Trimmed around parking signs in varies areas.
- Removal of dead shrubs in common areas.

PLEASE don't use the canyon or common area as a dump for your old plants or dead plant growth. Use your Green Waste container. We all want to enjoy the clean views from our patios and decks.

As a reminder, please do not trim/cut any trees in the common areas. If you have a concern, call PML or talk to a Board member. We have a process that we follow. Branches from common area trees that overhang a homeowner's yard are not trimmed by the HOA unless they present a fire hazard. Homeowners can trim branches that overhang their own property (but only over their property). Thanks for your cooperation.

Finally, the HOA is embarking soon on a project to survey our large trees in the common areas bordering our properties. This will be conducted by an outside firm from about late June to late July, and will provide us a concise accounting of the location and condition of each tree, along with recommendations for long-term care of our important neighbors. The workers will wear red and yellow vests for identification.

TRASH / RECYCLING - PLEASE FOLLOW CC&Rs & CITY LAWS

Please remember that, per CC&Rs Section 5.08 (and per SM City Code!), your trash and recycling bins need to be kept out of sight, except on pickup day or the day prior. They may not be stored anywhere in sight from a street, neighboring lot, or common area. Let's all help keep the neighborhood looking nice.
