ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE

Garage Door Reminder - Please note that garage door replacements require architectural approval for both type and color, per the CC&Rs.

Holiday Lighting – Per the previous request to remove lighting by Feb 20, please address this if you have not done so already.

Last call – Last chance to submit contact information for contractors you want to make other Sugarloaf residents aware of, such as plumbers, roofers, construction, handymen, etc. We'll publish a list on our website at some point in March. Please send any information to PML for collection.

LANDSCAPE

In addition to standard activities, the following work was or will be performed in common / easement areas during February/March:

- Spot spray weed killer along sidewalks.
- Cleaned up leaves/debris in visitor's parking areas along De Anza Blvd.
- Buried exposed irrigation pipes in common/easement areas on Toyon.
- Trimmed plants where needed on south side of De Anza.
- 6-7 dead trees will be removed by the wall on Parkwood Drive by 92. This is the 2nd year of our 3-year plan to rid the area of dead or diseased Pine Trees.
- Testing new type of sprinkler head in two areas on De Anza. Heads will use less water, thus saving money.
- Depending on the weather, irrigation system may be tested and turned on sometime in March. Please report any leaks you see to PML ASAP. This is the time they show up.

As a reminder, owners or their landscapers may not dispose of yard waste or trimmings on HOA common space. This is illegal dumping and will not be tolerated. Owners will be assessed cleanup fees if the HOA needs to perform cleanup.

Finally, please do not trim/cut any trees in common areas. Branches from common area trees that overhang a homeowner's yard are not trimmed by the HOA unless they present a fire hazard. If you want to trim for view (at your cost), or have a concern, call PML or talk to a Board member. We have a process to follow. The first step is for you to identify the work you would like done. The HOA has a list of approved arborists/firms that can perform work on HOA trees. You would submit a quotation from one of these approved firms to the HOA for board approval before any work is performed. Thanks for your cooperation.

TRASH / RECYCLING - PLEASE FOLLOW CC&Rs & CITY LAWS

Please remember that, per CC&Rs Section 5.08 (and per SM City Code!), your trash and recycling bins need to be kept out of sight, except on pickup day or the day prior. They may not be stored

anywhere in sight from a street, neighboring lot, or common area. Let's all help keep the neighborhood looking nice.
