Being a Good Neighbor – When we behave as good neighbors, the entire neighborhood benefits. For example, working and collaborating with neighbors to repair or upgrade tired mailbox installations. While this is an example of a voluntary collaborative effort, I also want to bring to your attention a new law in 2014 that *requires* good neighborly behavior when it comes to common fences. As described in more detail in the Architecture section, AB1404 California Civil Code § 841 ("The Good Neighbor Fence Act of 2013") became law in January 2014, and requires neighbors to share in the cost of common fences.

ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE

AB1404 California Civil Code § 841 ("The Good Neighbor Fence Act of 2013") — Our homes are now 30+ years old and fences separating adjoining properties are being repaired/replaced with increasing frequency. Sharing the cost of fence work is no longer an informal neighbor-to-neighbor arrangement, but a clear legal requirement. This law went into effect Jan 2014. LANDSCAPE

In addition to standard activities, the following work was or will be performed in common / easement areas during Aug/Sep:

- Landscape work near 3400 Chris Lane Took out bushes that were blocking view of oncoming cars on De Anza
- Tree trimming and removal of dead trees in common area between Cheryl Court and Chris Lane.
- Reprogram sprinkler times on lower De Anza due to power outage
- Spreading wood chips in areas on lower De Anza, when chips are available
- Phase 2 of our large tree trimming program is completed
- Start inspecting and clearing drains for expected (hopefully) wet winter
- Traffic barrier repair work on-going where necessary at the ends of the private lanes along De Anza

This is a gentle reminder to homeowners on the private lanes off De Anza – your mailboxes should not be placed on the traffic barriers or otherwise on HOA property. Any such boxes should be relocated to a typical post on homeowner property, as done for other homes.

Finally, please do not trim/cut any trees in common areas. Branches from common area trees that overhang a homeowner's yard are not trimmed by the HOA unless they present a fire hazard. If you want to trim for view (at your cost), or have a concern, call PML or talk to a Board member. We have a process to follow. The first step is for you to identify the work you would like done. The HOA has a list of approved arborists/firms that can perform work on HOA trees. You would submit a quotation from one of these approved firms to the HOA for board approval before any work is performed. Thanks for your cooperation.

TRASH / RECYCLING - PLEASE FOLLOW CC&Rs & CITY LAWS

Please remember that, per CC&Rs Section 5.08 (and per SM City Code!), your trash and recycling bins need to be kept out of sight, except on pickup day or the day prior. They may not be stored anywhere in sight from a street, neighboring lot, or common area. Let's all help keep the neighborhood looking nice.

PUBLIC SAFETY

Curbside House Numbering – Your curbside house number should have been repainted recently. Please note that this is a periodic activity funded through our Reserve Funds every few years. You will <u>not</u> be expected to pay for this repainting when it occurs.

EVENTS AROUND TOWN / DID YOU KNOW?

• Looking for a local Fall hike?

The El Corte de Madera Creek Open Space is an excellent choice with 36 miles of trails and 2,817 acres. A map is available on the Mid-Peninsula Open Space web site. Take the Tafoni Trial near the entrance of Skeggs Point for a viewing of the rare Tafoni sandstone formation which is 50 feet high. The large sandstone boulders have naturally eroded to create small, shallow caves in the rock, as well as designs resembling a stone honeycomb.

Enjoy the Redwood, Douglas fir, and Madrone trees on the Fir and Resolution Trails and check out the Methuselah Redwood tree which is a first-growth tree, has a 14 foot diameter, and is estimated to be over 1,800 years old.

The area was logged beginning in the 1860s, and 8 different mills along the creek banks were used in the preserve to log the redwoods for the next 50 years. The old logging roads provide numerous trail options. The preserve begins just 8.5 miles south of the intersection of 92 and Skyline Boulevard with parking at Skeggs Point.
