PRESIDENT'S CORNER

Drought conditions continue, and we will all need to be prepared for coming restrictions on water usage and potential increases in water costs. Please let us know if you believe water usage in a common space is incorrect. On a related note, drought conditions can drive changes in wildlife behavior. Be aware that coyotes and mountain lions have been observed in and around our area. Please exercise caution with your pets outside the home and while walking around the hillsides and canyons.

Termites are always a potential risk to our homes. Please note that a group of connected homes on De Anza will be tented and fumigated in May to eradicate a problem. This reminds everyone to review Article 4.02(c) describing the responsibilities of all owners within an attached group of homes when an infestation affects multiple homes and requires coordinated eradication.

As a reminder, annual dues became delinquent after Feb 15! Please contact PML if you have a financial hardship. Please don't ignore the dues invoice; that only makes matters worse ⊗.

ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE

Please remember that all exterior architectural changes require approval by the architectural control committee, as per our CC&Rs. This includes re-painting, re-roofing, new garage doors, new fences, new windows, new driveways, adding skylights or solar panels, etc. Also, any satellite dishes or antennas that will be visible from the outside of the residence must be first approved in writing. Please visit our website for lots of useful information and the project form you'll need to submit.

The architecture committee will conduct its annual exterior audit in mid-May, focused on issues that have negative effect on the appearance of our neighborhoods, such as paint condition, damaged exteriors, or excessive weeds or lack of sufficient landscaping. Thanks in advance for your cooperation in following up on identified issues.

LANDSCAPE

In addition to standard activities (e.g., litter removal), the following work was or will be performed in common / easement areas during April/May:

- Shrubbery trimmed on Toyon and Parkwood
- Three small trees removed on Parkwood
- New smart controller installed in zone 8

The common space Irrigation has been cut back to 2 times a week, which is a 33% reduction from last year. Given the drought conditions, homeowners should be cutting back significantly on outdoor watering as well.

The landscape committee did a site inspection of both common areas and private areas and found that most looked good, with minor exceptions. It was noted that some homeowners have let weeds grow in the cracks of their driveway. It spoils the look of the whole front yard. Per the CC&Rs Article 4.02(b), owners are responsible for ensuring landscape is maintained in a suitable condition.

Finally, please do not trim/cut any trees in common areas. Branches from common area trees that overhang a homeowner's yard are not trimmed by the HOA unless they present a fire hazard. If you want to trim for view (at your cost), or have a concern, call PML or talk to a Board member. We have a process to follow. The first step is for you to identify the work you would like done. The HOA has a list of approved arborists/firms that can perform work on HOA trees. You would submit a quotation from one of these approved firms to the HOA for board approval before any work is performed. Thanks for your cooperation.

TRASH / RECYCLING - PLEASE FOLLOW CC&Rs & CITY LAWS

Please remember that, per CC&Rs Section 5.08 (and per SM City Code!), your trash and recycling bins need to be kept out of sight, except on pickup day or the day prior. They may not be stored anywhere in sight from a street, neighboring lot, or common area. Let's all help keep the neighborhood looking nice.

Also, please recall that city code also requires picking up after your dog. Please be considerate of others' (including common space) property.
