## **PRESIDENT'S CORNER**

Annual Meeting and Elections – Thanks to the nearly 30 HOA members who attended the Annual Meeting on Tuesday, January 20. At the annual meeting, there were updates on the traffic visibility issue at the corner of Parkwood and De Anza (the city has indicated they will extend a red zone), open discussions about a fine policy for repeated violations of CC&R requirements, and about potential restrictions on rentals within the association.

**Importantly,** I need to remind everyone of your duty as a member of this association to cast your vote in the annual election. You received the ballot in late January. We must establish a quorum of votes to complete the election process. It takes only a few minutes to complete and return your ballot by mail, but they must be received at PML by no later than Thursday, Feb 26. Please contact PML ASAP if you need a new ballot.

Finally, as a reminder, **annual dues became delinquent after Feb 15!** Please contact PML if you have a financial hardship. Please don't ignore the dues invoice; that only makes matters worse  $\otimes$

## **ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE**

Please remember that all exterior architectural changes require approval by the architectural control committee, as per our CC&Rs. This includes re-painting, re-roofing, new garage doors, new fences, new windows, new driveways, adding skylights or solar panels, etc. Also, any **satellite dishes or antennas** that will be visible from the outside of the residence **must be first approved in writing.** Please visit our website for lots of useful information and the project form you'll need to submit.

As a reminder, holiday lighting was requested to be removed by February 15. Thanks!

## **LANDSCAPE**

In addition to standard activities (e.g., litter removal), the following work was or will be performed in common / easement areas during February/March:

- Cleaned up and removed tree debris from Feb storm
- Trimmed shrubbery on Toyon and Parkwood
- Raked around all storm drains, will continue to monitor drains
- Set irrigation controllers to water once a week, will adjust according to weather.

We had one tree along Parkwood down from the Feb weekend storm (nothing came down during the December storm). The tree did hit a house, but caused very little damage to the house or yard. Phase 3 of our tree maintenance program is scheduled to start in March.

At the Board meeting this month, we will finalize our plans to upgrade the irrigation control system. This project will start with testing new equipment in irrigation zone 8 (upper Parkwood).

Finally, please do not trim/cut any trees in common areas. Branches from common area trees that overhang a homeowner's yard are not trimmed by the HOA unless they present a fire hazard. If you want to trim for view (at your cost), or have a concern, call PML or talk to a Board member. We have a process to follow. The first step is for you to identify the work you would like done. The HOA has a list of approved arborists/firms that can perform work on HOA trees. You would submit a quotation from one of these approved firms to the HOA for board approval before any work is performed. Thanks for your cooperation.

# TRASH / RECYCLING - PLEASE FOLLOW CC&Rs & CITY LAWS

Please remember that, per CC&Rs Section 5.08 (and per SM City Code!), your trash and recycling bins need to be kept out of sight, except on pickup day or the day prior. They may not be stored anywhere in sight from a street, neighboring lot, or common area. Let's all help keep the neighborhood looking nice.

Also, please recall that city code also requires **picking up after your dog.** Please be considerate of others' (including common space) property.
