- Received feedback to coordinate with Laurelwood Neighborhood

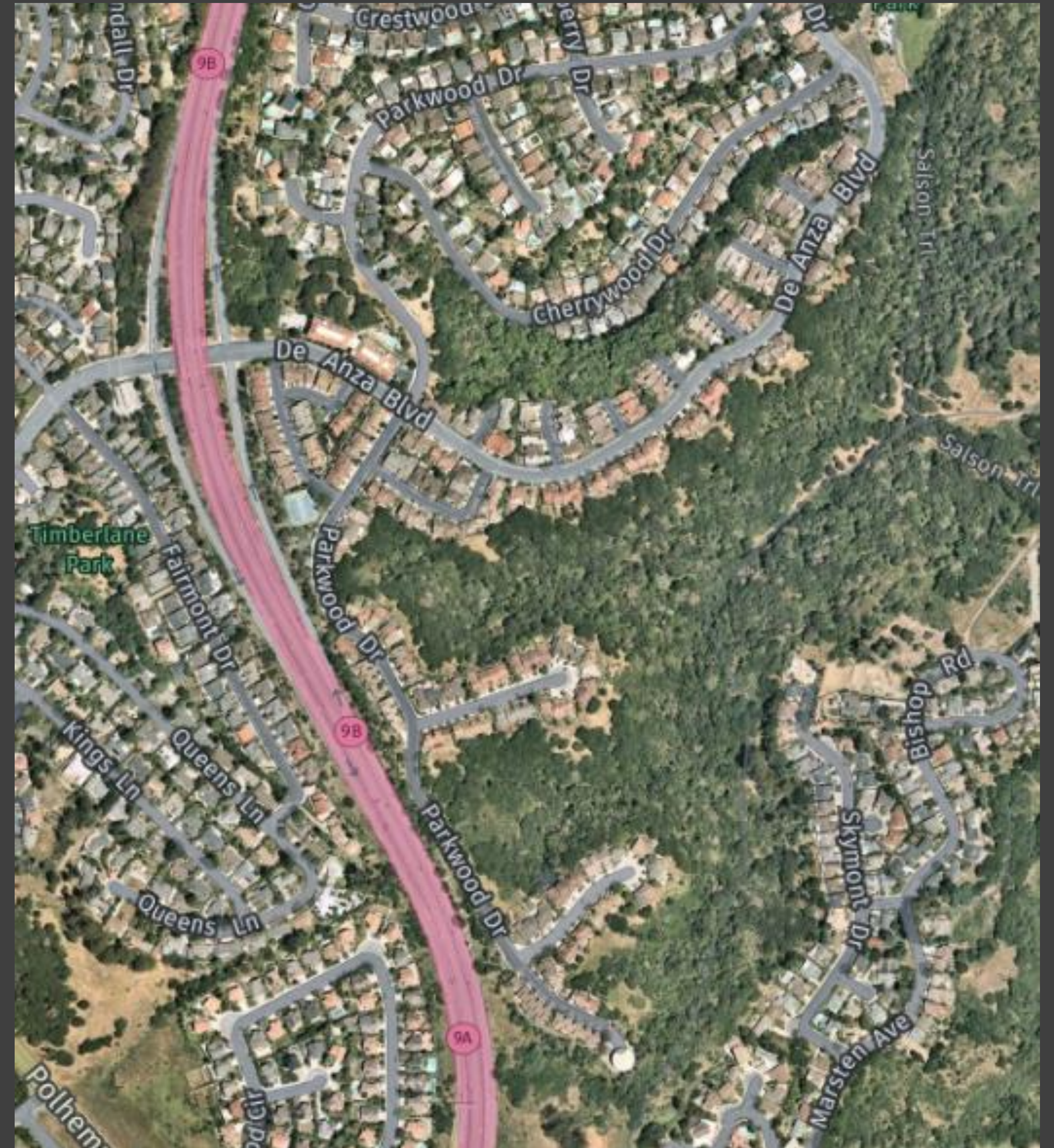
October 2020

Sugarloaf Neighborhood TAP

Priority items:

1. Speeding on De Anza
2. Cut-through on De Anza
3. Speeding near the De Anza/Parkwood intersection
4. Pedestrian safety crossing De Anza at Parkwood
5. Pedestrian safety crossing Parkwood
6. Sight distance at driveways
7. Bike safety on De Anza
8. Southbound Parkwood intersection visibility at De Anza
9. Speeding on Parkwood south of De Anza



TAP Item Nos. 5 & 8



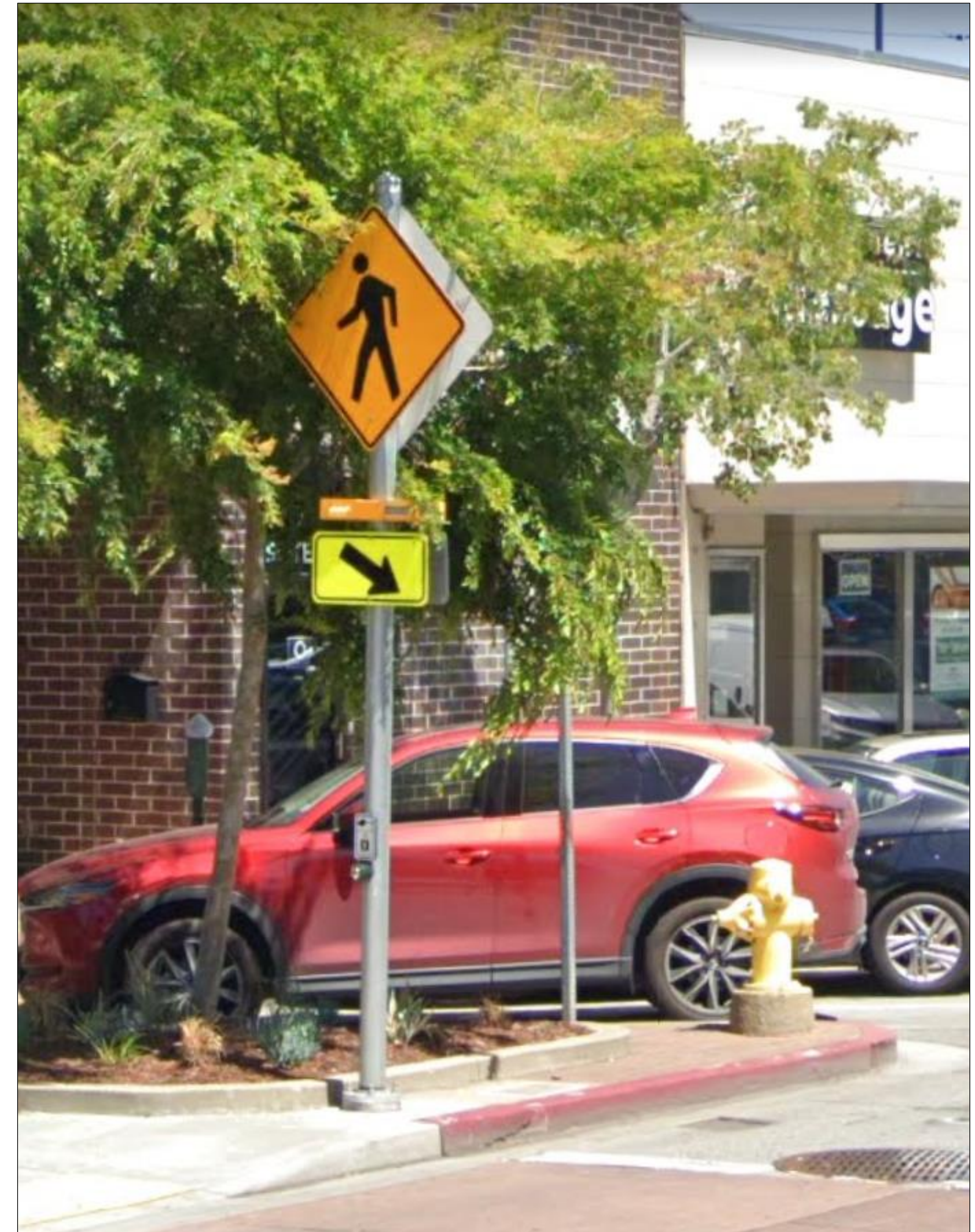
TAP Item No. 9 - Parkwood Striping



- Concerns about speeding in this segment
- Installed SLOW legends and centerline/edgeline striping

Upcoming Work

- Install RRFB for De Anza crosswalk at Parkwood Drive (RRFB = flashing light activated by pedestrian
These were installed early Feb 2021)
- Install curb extensions with striping and delineators
- Work with Laurelwood Neighborhood to develop their TAP (This is related to the question of placing speed cushions on De Anza to reduce speed)
